

Greetings from the Crypt! Thank you all very much for putting your faith in me to lead the Most Illustrious Grand Council of Cryptic Masons for the coming year. I am humbled! I promise to do my very best to lead and to set the example on how best to be a Cryptic Mason. I thank my installation team — Companions Tommy Thompson, Jim Crenner, Grover Sardeson and Ron Birely - for executing an outstanding and memorable installation. This honor is truly a high point in my Masonic travels. These Companions have been with me for my entire Masonic career. Each of them is a dear and close friend.

My theme for the year is Integrity which to me means that all officers and Companions will fully perform the duties they swore on the Holy Bible to perform as they were initiated and installed. Personal integrity is defined with the five following attributes: follow a set of values; be honest, help others, lead by example, and take responsibility. In other words – reliability, honesty, loyalty and trustworthiness. All traits that each of us as Masons should embrace.

WHAT IS CRYPTIC MASONRY?

The question is often asked, "What is the Council of Cryptic Masons"? Why is it called Cryptic Masonry? Why is it part of the York Rite? We suspect that a number of our Companions, some long-time Cryptic Masons may stumble in trying to fully explain what Cryptic Masonry is and what it refers to in its origins. Many Brothers and Companions view Cryptic Masonry as the "York Rite, Part 2" or a necessary step to becoming a Knight Templar. Both of these statements are accurate, but don't adequately explain Cryptic Masonry. Perhaps we can share some information that may help our Companions to have a better understanding.

An outstanding source of information is the "*Cryptic Masonry Education Course*" – a Modern Monitor, published by the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International. The author is Robert G. Davis, a Past Master of three Oklahoma lodges, a 33° Scottish Rite Mason and recipient of the Grand Cross, a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma and Past Grand High Priest fo the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Mason in Oklahoma. The book is available on Amazon for about \$25 and is highly recommended reading. We will share some key points and direct quotations from the book with you in this brief communication.

The author explains that the Council Degrees are an elaboration and explanation of the Master Mason Degree of the Craft Lodge and the Royal Arch Degree of the Chapter. In both the Royal and Select Master, one of the essential themes in all of Masonry is explained and expanded upon. In the process, the deepest secret in Masonry is unveiled.

The word cryptic is derived from the Greek *crupe* or the Latin *crypta*, which means to hide, or conceal. All Cryptic degrees are centered on stories involving a vault or crypt.

The beginnings of the Royal and Select Master, or Cryptic Degrees may be traced to the forerunner bodies that later evolved into the Supreme Council of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite in the mid 1760's or soon after. In the early 1870's the General Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the United States was organized for the sole purpose of watching over and protecting the interests of Cryptic Masons in the United States.

"The apron of a Cryptic Mason is white, bordered on the sides and bottom and lower edges of the flap with a band of purple, with purple strings or tape. The jewels are, described in ritual language, "The sword and trowel have been adopted by Masons of the Royal Arch to commemorate the valor of those worthy Masons who carried on the building of the Second Temple, with the trowel in their hands and the sword by their sides, that they might ever be ready to defend the Holy City and sanctuary against the unprovoked attacks of their enemies; but which they left a sacred and impressive lesson

to succeeding ages: that next to the obedience due to lawful authority; and many and determined resistance to the lawless violence is the first step to social justice."

"The sword and trowel of a Royal and Select Master's Council are therefore appropriate emblems because the Council represents a union or bridge between the Ancient Craft and Royal Arch Masonry."

We hope that this brief refresher on Cryptic Masonry will have piqued your interest anew and that you will further your education on the Royal and Select Master Degrees.

Future issues of *Tales from the Crypt* will include material written by the well-known Masonic scholar and ritualist Albert G. Mackey. We will also feature instructions, written in 1870 by Jackson H. Chase, 33° and Grand Lecturer to the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of New York.



Cryptic Mason Training
